

Capucine Hat Pattern by SpiderWomanKnits

This is a more detailed, step-by-step, row-by-row, pattern alteration by [SpiderWomanKnits](#). This pattern is best for Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick or for other super bulky yarn and US 11 needles.

I ended up not using this pattern in the end, but you can see the almost finished version of it on my [Raverly project page for this hat](#). It's the 4th picture on the bottom. The pattern I used is on the next page. Hope this helps. If you have any questions just ask.

1. c/o 70 stitches
2. k2p2 ribbing for 2" ~9/10 rows
3. knit two rows (garter stitch)

Begin Decreases. Each row will in garter stitch and decreased by 4 stitches unless otherwise noted.

1. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k58, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 66 stitches
2. k66
3. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k54, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 62 stitches
4. k62
5. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k50, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 58 stitches
6. k58
7. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k46, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 54 stitches
8. k54
9. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k42, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 50 stitches
10. k50
11. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k38, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 46 stitches
12. k46
13. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k34, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 42 stitches
14. k1, k2tog, k36, k2tog, k1 > 40 stitches **note only 2 decreases**

Rows 15-20 knit (garter stitch)

Switch to DPNs or magic loop, you will start knitting in the round now.

Rows 21-24 knit in the round (stockinette stitch)

25. (k3, k2tog) > 32 stitches
26. k32
27. (k2, k2tog) > 24 stitches
28. k24
29. (k1, k2tog) > 16 stitches
30. k16
31. (k2tog) > 8 stitches

Break off yarn about 6". Use tapestry needle and pull through remaining stitches. Fasten top, weave in ends, add tassels, i-cord, pom-poms, or whatever you prefer.

REMEMBER!

I didn't end up using this pattern because I wanted the ear flaps to be longer, plus I wanted the hat to be roomier. That pattern is on the next page.

This has was based of the green hat in [this Humon comics strip](#). This hat is a bit roomier, so please take the pattern into account. I also made the ear flaps longer. Also I didn't use tassels, but i-cords and pom-pom. Hope this patterns helps!

Needles: US 11, DPNs, fixed circulars 16"-24" should be fine
Yarn: Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick or other super bulky yarn

I used the [the original pattern by Adela Illichmanova](#), but not with size US 10s or normal bulky yarn.

Follow [her pattern](#) for the first 18 rows.

The following are the revisions I made:

19. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k54, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 62 stitches
20. k62
21. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k50, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 58 stitches
22. k58
23. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k46, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 54 stitches
24. k54
25. k1, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k42, k2tog, k1, k2tog, k1 > 50 stitches
26. k50
27. k1, k2tog, 44, k2tog, k1 > 48 stitches **note, only 2 decreases**

Rows 28-32: k48 (garter stitch still)

Switch to DPNs or magic loop, you will start knitting in the round now.
Rows 32-35 knit in the round (stockinette stitch)

The rest is from Adela's pattern (rows 13-21)

- 36: (k4, k2tog)* => 40 stitches left
- 37: k40
- 38: (k3, k2tog)* => 32 stitches left
- 39: k32
- 40: (k2, k2tog)* => 24 stitches left
- 41: k24
- 42: (k1, k2tog)* => 16 stitches left
- 43: k16
- 44: (k2tog)* => 8 stitches left

Break off yarn about 6". Use tapestry needle and pull through remaining stitches. Fasten top, weave in ends, add tassels, i-cord, pom-poms, or whatever you prefer.

I used i-cords. Pick up 3 stitches in the center area on the ends of the ear flaps. Make an i-cord for however long you prefer. On the last 3 stitches, pull yarn back and forth through the loops for about 1.5"+ on each side. Cut yarn and tie in a knot. Cut end of loops to make tassels.

Make pom-poms of whatever size you want/need. I used the Clover pom-pom maker in the 3-3/8" diameter. Attache it with the thread leftover from closing off the hat.

I pretty much almost used an entire skein of the Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick. I probably had 5 yards left over, so to make this hat, it was about 100 yards.
